Memorial service sees a flood of rich tributes



Accused carjacker has history of arrests

■ Shreveporter was out on a one-year supervised probation.

The Shreveport man arrested Friday for two carjackings over three days had pleaded guilty two weeks ago to a similar felony charge and was out on probation, according to Caddo Parish court records.

Friday also marked the second time in less than six months that 24-year-old Bryan Colt Todd was arrested on vehicle theft-related charges. He was arrested in December

and has an extensive criminal history that includes convictions for DWI, simple criminal property damage and theft. His arrest record, dating back to 2000, includes multiple charges of resisting an officer, possession of a controlled substance, driving under suspension and drunk and disorderly conduct.

"Arresting him was good for the citizens of Shreveport," police Detective Craig Ivy said. "He's had a bad drug addiction for a while, and he's been taking vehicles and doing anything he can to get the drugs."
